

Course Guide for UO English Majors Participating in Winter 2010 London Program

Please note that these terms ONLY apply to the program at the London AHA Centre affiliated with the UO English Department, ONLY during Winter 2010 term, and ONLY for UO English majors.

If you are graduating before Winter 2011, you must be sure to complete the second part of the Introduction to the Major sequence (English 221) beforehand. Please be aware that course is only taught on the UO home campus in Eugene and only in Winter term. This may cause a conflict for some of those interested in the Winter in London program.

1. All courses (History, English, Art History, and Theatre) can apply to English major requirements. Each course can only apply to one major requirement

ARH (Victorian Art and Architecture) can apply to 1789-Present UD requirement or UD elective requirement.

HIST (Tudor England) can apply to 1500-1789 UD requirement or UD elective requirement.

TA (London Theatre) can apply to 1500-1789 UD requirement, 1789-Present UD requirement, or UD elective requirement.

ENG (Reinventing Nature) can apply to 1789-Present requirement or UD elective requirement.

ENG (The Victorian City) can apply to 1789-Present requirement or UD elective requirement.

2. As long as they are enrolled in three courses for 15 units, English majors can fulfill an additional UD elective requirement for the major by enrolling in a 1-credit English 401 course with Prof. Stein entitled "London Experience." An online course, the course will allow students to reflect on their London experience. The credit for this course combines with the 5 credits for the three other courses to yield a total of 16 units. These 16 units can then be applied to four 4-credit English major requirements with the "additional" fulfilled requirement only applicable to the UD elective requirement. The 1-credit course is only open to English majors.
