# PSY 205 Psychology as a Social Science 180 PLC, 12:30-1:50 UH

## Course Objectives:

- 1. To acquaint students with the broad areas of developmental, social, personality, and abnormal psychology. In particular, the course will be organized around the concept of self and identity. ## Exams and grading procedures:

There will be 2 midterm exams and a final exam.

Exam I will cover chapters 9-11, and discussions and lecture through April 19.

Exam II will cover chapters 17, 18, and 13, and discussions and lecture from April 26 through May 10.

The Final exam will be comprehensive but will stress mainly chapters 14-16, and lectures and discussions from May 17-June 2.

Your grade will be based on the following:

- 45% 1. One midterm exam. Your lowest sore will be dropped.
- 45% 2. Final exam.
- 10% 3. Discussion section attendance.

Since one of your midterm scores will be dropped, there will be no make-ups given. It is in your best interest to take both of the midterms since the final is comprehensive. Each examination (including the final) will consist of 80 multiple choice questions from the book, lecture, and material covered in discussion sections. You will be given 2 points for attendance at each section.

## Research Participation and Extra Credit:

The psychology department requires participation in research for introductory courses. In this course, you may meet that requirement in one of two ways:

- Participation in ongoing research projects by being a subject in 3 experiments. (See additional handout).
- Being a subject in your own experiments by filling out 3
  of several personality inventories and writing a short
  report on your experience.

In addition, you may do up to 3 of the personality inventories for extra credit. They will each be worth 3 points, for a total of 9 extra credit points.
