Exams and Grading Policy: There will be three in-class midterms and a final. The final will consist of two parts. The first part of the final will cover the material covered in the last quarter of the course. It will count as a fourth midterm. The second part of the final will be cumulative. Your grade will be computed in the following way. You may drop the lowest of the grades on the four midterms. Your grade will reflect the average of your three highest grades on the midterms and your score on the cumulative part of the final.

There will be no make—up exams. If you miss one of the midterms, that will be the grade that is dropped. You should <u>not</u> miss more than one midterm under any circumstances. If you do, you will be asked to drop the course. Under NO circumstances will the final be given to any student at an earlier time than scheduled. If you know you will not be able to take the exam when scheduled, then drop the course.

Extra Credit: You will have an opportunity to raise your grade by doing some additional outside work. Approximately every other week, I will assign a short written assignment (2-3 pages) asking you to further explore one of the topics raised in class or in lecture. I greatly encourage you to complete these outside assignments because in addition to the possibility of raising your grade directly, they will broaden your understanding of the material in the course and give you another opportunity to express what you have learned.
