## Course Requirements:

This is an advanced undergraduate/graduate course. Students in this course are expected to be able to read and write at that level. If you feel uncomfortable with this expectation, do not take this course.

Examinations: There will be two examinations. A short quiz on July 8, 1996 (20% of the final grade) and a final examination on the last day of class (50% of final grade). The examinations will be composed of a combination of short essay questions and multiple choice questions. The examinations will cover all of the material presented in class and in the readings listed on the syllabus prior to the examination date.

<u>Term Project</u>: Students will also be required to complete an annotated bibliography of their reading for the course (30% of final grade). This will include each assigned reading and at least 4 additional articles or cases on a subject of the student's choice. For each <u>article</u>, prepare at least a 1 page summary including: the complete citation, a short summary (including when applicable the hypotheses, methods, and results), and a short critique of the ideas, methods, results, and discussion. The bibliography will be graded for content (10%), analysis (10%), and writing (10%).
