## **Course Overview**

This course will review assessment, diagnosis and treatment of psychopathology from psychological, biological, and sociocultural perspectives. Because the universe of material is beyond the scope of this course, we will focus on the major mental disorders including disorders of mood, psychotic states, anxiety, personality disorders and substance abuse and dependency. Other less pervasive disorders will be discussed as time allows, e.g., eating disorders, sexual disorders, etc. Some disorders will not be discussed in class; however, you will be assigned readings in your text and subsequently tested about this information. Please note that you are held responsible for ALL information presented by the text (which includes disorders that will not be discussed in class) as well as readings assigned in class, speakers and films.

Readings:

<u>Fundamentals of Abnormal Psychology</u> by Ronald J. Comer. W.H. Freeman and Company 1996. This text is available at the University of Oregon Bookstore.

Requirements:

Each student is required to complete two midterm exams as well as a cumulative final that will be administered on Monday, June 9, 1997 from 10:15 am - 12:15 pm. If you are taking this course for graduate credit you must talk with Dr. Hamilton by April 15, 1997.
