Content: We will discuss human development in three domains: physical/biological, social/behavioral/personality, and cognitive/intellectual. The focus will be on development from conception to adolescence (we will not discuss adulthood and aging). You will learn about research and science in human development, with a special focus on applications of this knowledge in the real world.

Textbook (required): Kail, Robert V. (2002). *Children*. Upper Saddle River, NJ: Prentice Hall/Pearson Education. One copy is on 4-hour reserve at Knight Library.

Grading: Grade based on three exams: two non-cumulative **mid-term** exams (33% each), and one non-cumulative **final** exam (34%). Standard 10-point +/- scale is used (e.g., 80% to 83% B-; 84% to 86% B; 87% to 89% B+, etc.). Each exam will cover 1/3 of the course. Exams are a combination of multiple-choice and short-answer (3-5 sentence response) questions. **No make-up or rescheduled exams **, except in truly extraordinary circumstances.
