

Field Studies: Innovative Portland Landscapes

This one-week intensive field class will explore some of Portland's most innovative examples of landscape architecture and planning among both legacy and recent example places. The emphasis will be on landscapes in or near downtown, including recent new urban neighborhoods, transit-centered projects, green roofs, plazas, parks, and green streets, as well as examples of ecological restoration and integrated storm water designs away from downtown. The class will entail substantial walking and riding public transit as well as van or bus trips. Design professionals involved in forming the examples will often be field guides along with occasional clients, contractors, public activists and public officials. Class content will cover the history, politics, design-process, regulatory issues, budgeting and detailing of the landscapes.
