Thank you for considering input by faculty concerning the proposed COI/COC policy. I especially appreciate your attendance at a meeting of the law school faculty last month.

I'm just writing to indicate that I support the positions taken by Dean Margie Paris, Associate Dean Michael Moffitt, and Professor John Bonine in their recent submissions to your office.

I would only add one more consideration. The decline of the stock market has caused a great deal of anxiety among those of us who are trying to save for our kids' college education. I have been counting on my ability to supplement our family's college savings through some off-campus work. I hope that the COC policy will be no more restrictive than is minimally necessary to comply with state and federal regulations. I would be thrilled if the UO decided to follow the "one in five" rule that former Dean Gene Scoles has mentioned to our faculty.

Thanks again for considering the views of faculty on this important issue.
