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DR. BARBARA BAIRD has been a member of the University of Oregon music faculty since 1989, teaching organ, piano and harpsichord. She is also Director of Music Ministries at First Congregational Church, Eugene, Oregon, where she has served since 1982.

An active recitalist since 1971, Baird has performed throughout the United States as well as Europe, Argentina, Brazil, and Australia. In 1984-85 she presented a series of nine all-Bach organ and harpsichord recitals in Eugene in honor of the Bach Tercentenary, and in 1993 she did a two-week organ tour of Germany. In 1995 she was the only American invited to participate in the International Swiss Organ Festival. In January 1999 Baird was the featured organ and harpsichord soloist in the Ballarat Goldfields Music Festival in Australia. Her organ recital received the first standing ovation ever given at this festival. She was invited to return to the Ballarat Festival in January 2001, again in January 2005, and again in January 2012.

A frequent adjudicator and clinician, she regularly conducts workshops and master classes for keyboardists, particularly on Baroque and Classic Period Performance Practice. Baird has been a presenter and/or recitalist for many local American Guild of Organists chapters, at both regional and national American Guild of Organists Conventions, as well as for the Organ Historical Society, Oregon Bach Festival, and piano teacher's guilds in the United States and Australia.
