with the Oregon Brass Quintet and making solo appearances, Dunn performs regularly with the Music in the Mountains Festival, the Oregon Festival of American Music, and in a trumpet/percussion duo with John Pennington. Prior to his appointment at the University of Oregon, Dunn served on the faculties of the University of Denver and Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado.

Steve Leisring is assistant professor of trumpet at the University of Kansas. He previously performed for 14 seasons with the Tenerife Symphony Orchestra, Canary Islands, Spain. With the orchestra, he performed in major halls throughout Spain and Europe. Festival performances included the Schleswig-Holstein and Mecklenburg festivals in Germany, as well as those in Santander, Granada, San Sebastian, and the Canary Islands. As soloist, Leisring has performed recitals in the United States, Europe, and Central America; most recently in Spain and Guatemala as part of the duo, Arias y Fanfarias with wellknown American soprano, Pamela Hinchman. He has been a featured soloist and principal trumpet on two world-premiere recordings by Spanish composer Enrique Guimera. Other orchestral includes performances with the Gothenburg Symphony Orchestra, Milwaukee Symphony, and the Dallas Symphony Leisring is a regular performer at the Music in the Mountains Festival in Durango, CO. An active teacher since arriving in Kansas, Leisring had previously taught at the Conservatorio Superior de Musica de Santa Cruz de Tenerife; Esucuela de Musica de Arona; and most recently as professor of trumpet and chamber music at the Tenerife Symphony Academy of Orchestral Studies. Leisring holds degrees from the University of North Texas and the Mannes College of Music. Former teachers include Vincent Penzarella of the NY Philharmonic, Rick Giangiulio and Bert Truax, formerly of the Dallas Symphony, Don Jacoby, Keith Johnson, and Leonard Candelaria at the University of North Texas.
