

ABOUT TONIGHT'S GUEST ARTIST

Charles Schuchat, has performed and recorded with the Chicago Symphony, Boston Symphony and Israel Philharmonic. In addition to being principal tuba with the Chicago Sinfonietta and Elgin Symphony Orchestra, he is a member of Tower Brass. Schuchat is also principal tuba with the Joffrey Ballet Orchestra and a member of the award winning Asbury Brass Quintet. He has participated in numerous music festivals including the Spoleto Festival, Ravinia Festival, Brevard, Grant Park and Tanglewood Music Festival. While at Tanglewood he received the CD Jackson Award for Achievement. He spent the 1997-98 season as principal tuba of the Israel Philharmonic, and is currently a faculty member at both Northern Illinois University and the Chicago College of Performing Arts of Roosevelt University. Schuchat is a native of Washington, D.C. He is a graduate of Northwestern University where he studied with Arnold Jacobs.
