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ABOUT TODAY'S GUEST ARTIST

Oregon native, trombonist, **Peter Ellefson**, joined the music faculty of Indiana University in 2002. He performs frequently with the Chicago Symphony and the New York Philharmonic. He is also an active chamber musician having recently performed with Proteus 7, the New York Philharmonic Brass Quintet, Chicago Brass Quintet, Chicago Chamber Musicians and Tower Brass of Chicago. Ellefson was a member of the Seattle Symphony for 10 years, performing and recording on alto and tenor trombone, bass trumpet and tenor tuba. He also served as principal trombonist for Seattle Opera's productions of Wagner's *Der Ring des Nibelungen*. In addition to Indiana University, Ellefson is the associate teacher at the Alessi Seminar and has taught at the University of Costa Rica and the Music Academy of the West in Santa Barbara, CA.

**Hung-Yun Chu** is a native of Taiwan. She holds a Doctoral degree in piano performance and piano accompanying from the University of Oregon, where she studied with Dean Kramer, and a Master's degree in piano performance from Peabody Conservatory of Music, where she studied with Marian Hahn. Chu has been selected to perform in many competitions, including the International Taipei Piano Competition (2003), the Rachmaninoff International Piano competition (2002), and the Baltimore Music Club competition (1997). She was invited to perform a Baltimore premiere of *Duo Ye* by renowned composer Chen Yi in 1997. She has performed extensively in Taiwan, Korea, Canada, and throughout the Northwest. Currently, Chu works as a freelance soloist and collaborative pianist in Eugene where she works at the University of Oregon and with local arts organizations including the Oregon Bach Festival, Eugene Vocal Arts Ensemble, and Oregon Festival Choirs.

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
