phony. A frequent recital performer, Andrew has presented concerts and master classes worldwide. She specializes in performances and presentations related to Marcel Moyse and has been featured as a guest artist in this capacity for the National Flute Association, the Utah Flute Association, the Central California Flute Association, and the Swiss Flute Association, among others. Andrew is the founder, former president, and now executive director of the Marcel Moyse Society. The primary editor of the Moyse Society newsletter, she is also editing the collected writings of Marcel Moyse for future publication. Andrew has long been active in the national flute community, serving two terms on the board of the National Flute Association (NFA), adjudicating several NFA competitions, including the Young Artist Competition, and performing at numerous conventions. She is the Program Chair for the 2007 convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico.
