63. Guardian of the North (Tamonten), one of the Four Guardian Kings. Ca. 650. Main Hall (Kondō), Hōryū-ji. Wood with pigments and gold leaf. 135 cm.

54., 62. Main Hall (Kondō), pagoda, etc. in compound of Hōryū-ji temple, SW of Nara. Begun 607 (as Wakakusa-dera), burned 670, rebuilt 670-710 as Hōryū-ji.

56. Main Hall (Kondō), Hōryū-ji. Second half 7th c. Wood, plaster, tiles, stone.

52. Cloud bracket, Main Hall (Kondō), Hōryū-ji.

59. Five-storied pagoda, Hōryū-ji. Second half 7th c. Wood, plaster, tiles, stone.

70. Tableau of the Death of Shaka Buddha. 711. North side of the Five-storied pagoda, Hōryū-ji. Clay over an armature of wood and metal. Each figure approx. 40-55 cm.

72. Amida triad. Wall painting in the Main Hall (Kondō), Hōryū-ji. Ca. 710. Pigments and gold leaf on plaster. 310X260 cm. Lost in fire of 1949.

Colorplate 4. Hall of Dreams Kannon (Yumedono Kannon). Early 7th c. Hōryū-ji. Gilt wood. H. 197 cm.

80. Disciple of Buddha (Kasenen). West Hall (Saikondō), Kōfuku-ji. Ca. 734. Dry lacquer over a wooden armature, pigments. H. 150 cm.

86. Fukukenjaku Kannon, Lotus Hall (Hokkedō). 740s, Tōdai-ji. Dry lacquer over a wooden armature, gold leaf. Lotus dias, gilt wood. Mandorla, gilt bronze. H. 362 cm. Colorplate 7. Shūkongōjin. Lotus Hall (Hokkedō), Tōdai-ji. 733. Clay, pigments. H. 174cm.

94. Shaka on a lotus petal of the original base of the Great Buddha statue (original statue lost in fire). Mid-8th c. Engraving on bronze. Great Buddha Hall, Tōdai-ji

96. <u>Lady Under a Tree</u>, detail, screen panel. Mid-8th c. Shōsō-in collection, Tōdai-ji. Pigments and ink on paper. Originally decorated with pheasant feathers. H. 125 cm.

Colorplate 9. Near Eastern Entertainers Riding an Elephant. Plectrum guard of a lute. 8th c. Chinese? Painted leather. Shōsō-in collection, Tōdai-ji. 42 X 18 cm.

Colorplate 10. Deva (named Kichijōten). Second half 8th c. Color on hemp cloth. H.53cm.
