Marilyn Chin codirects the M.F.A. program at San Diego State University. She has won numerous awards for her poetry, including ones from the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard, the Rockefeller Foundation, and the National Endowment for the Arts. Chin has received a Wallace Stegner Fellowship, the PEN/Josephine Miles Literary Award, and four Pushcart Prizes. She has translated poems by the modern Chinese poet Ai Qing. Her latest book, to be published in September 2009 by W. W. Norton, is *Revenge of the Mooncake Vixen*, a collection of poetic tales.
