Danny Anderson, a new faculty member in the UO Creative Writing Program, is the author of two books of poems: *Drunk in Sunlight* and *January Rain*. His work has appeared in *Poetry*, *The Kenyon Review*, *New England Review*, *The Yale Review*, *The Hudson Review*, *Harper's*, *The New Republic*, *The Southern Review*, *The Sewanee Review*, *The Best American Poetry*, and *Southwest Review* among other places. He is the recipient of a Pushcart Prize as well as fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Bogliasco Foundation. He has held teaching positions at the University of Alabama, Birmingham, Kenyon College, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee, and Murray State University.
