Application Guidelines

Applications must be submitted to the Kidd Tutorial Director via the Creative Writing Program office (104 Alder Building).

Applicants need to be willing to make a yearlong commitment to the Kidd Program; you should make sure that courses required for your major will not conflict with the Mon/Weds class time (2-3:50) throughout the year. The Kidd Tutorial is a mandatory attendance course. This is a rigorous, time-intensive course. In general, successful applicants carry no more than 15-16 hours total per term, including the Kidd credit hours.

Because each Kidd Tutorial section is small (5-7 students), successful applicants need to be willing to participate extensively during class discussions.

Every applicant who has a 3.5 GPA or higher is eligible for one of 12 scholarships (two \$6,000; ten \$3,000).

Scholarships will be awarded based on the merits of the student's writing sample.

The following materials must be submitted with your application:

- 1 An up-to-date copy of your <u>transcript</u> with GPA. A downloaded, printed copy from DuckWeb is acceptable.
- 2 A <u>recommendation</u> from an instructor who can describe your creative and scholarly pursuits, as well as your responsibility, attendance, and participation in class. The instructor must complete the form and return it in an envelope, sealed and signed across the flap, directly to the Creative Writing Program office. Should the instructor choose instead to write a letter, he or she may follow the directions on the attached form.
- 3 A <u>writing sample</u> of work in the applicant's preferred genre: three poems, or up to fifteen pages of fiction (no more than two short stories total). Plays, screenplays, and journalism are not accepted. The work you submit should be an example of your very best writing and should be proofread rigorously. Manuscripts must be typed. If a piece is longer than one page, it must be stapled and have your last name and page number, starting on the second page, in the upper right-hand corner. Prose must be double-spaced. All work submitted must have a 12-point Times Roman font and one-inch margins all around.
- 4 A typed <u>statement of interest</u>, 3-4 double-spaced pages in length with a 12-point Times Roman font and one-inch margins all around, addressing the following:
 - What kinds of questions drive you as a writer? What themes arise in your work?
 - What literary authors have influenced your work and why? (Please be specific in terms of craft and style.)
 - Describe your interdisciplinary interests, for example art history, music, philosophy, environmentalism, women's studies, cultural studies, etc. How might these interests enrich the tutorial and your writing?
 - Can you make a yearlong commitment and why would you find it valuable to do so?
 - What do you believe you have to offer in an environment that stresses both creative expression and rigorous scholarly engagement? Will you be able to participate extensively during class discussions?
