

## **Lillis Business Complex Facts**

- First certified environmentally friendly business school facility in the United States (LEED Silver Certification).
- The blue squares embedded in the windows of the Lillis Business Complex are solar cells that generate electricity.
- The Lillis Business Complex has five solar arrays on it, which generate 44kW of the electricity (enough to power seven average-size homes year round).
- The architectural solar glass with the solar cells embedded was the largest (and one of the first) in the United States when it was installed in 2003.
- The Lillis Business Complex opened in 2003. Subsequent complete modernizations and renovations to the historic wings on the west and east of the courtyard (Peterson and Anstett Halls) were completed 2009 and 2011.
- The Lillis Business Complex is named for Chuck and Gwen Lillis. Chuck Lillis earned his PhD in
  finance at the University of Oregon. Chuck Lillis is a pioneer of the Internet. In the 1990s, he was
  CEO and chairman of MediaOne, which later became Comcast. Comcast is the company it is
  today because of Lillis's foresight and vision to see that cable television lines would be used to
  provide broadband Internet and phone services to individual homes across the country.
