## UO commencement speaker was the first graduate of the Clark Honors College Margaret Moore's family includes four generations of Ducks

EUGENE, Ore. -- (June 2, 2011) - Margaret Moore was the first graduate of the Robert D. Clark Honors College in 1961 earning a bachelor's degree in education and Phi Beta Kappa honors. As the keynote speaker at the 2011 University Graduation Celebration at 9:30 a.m. on June 13, at Hayward Field, she will provide a unique perspective of family and academia.

After graduating from the UO, she earned a master's degree from the University of Washington, and had a long, successful career as an educator, school psychologist and administrator for the school district in Issaquah, Wash.

In retirement, Moore has been active in family support agencies in King County, Wash., including the United Way Eastside Community Council, the Educational Tutoring and Consulting School, and the Eastside Human Services Forum.
