full and perfect strength of body and mind blessed be
God therefore doe make this my last Will and Testament
in manner following first I bequeath my soul to God that
gave it and my Body to the Earth from whence it came to be
interred and decently buried in the Chancel in Malden Church
by my dear Husband and privately by my Grandson George
Morley whom I appoint and ordain sole Excutor of this
my last Will and Testament desiring him to pay my just
debts and these my Legacies following Item I give unto my
Daughter Penelope Morley Ten pounds for mourning
and to Major Kilby and his Wife my Daughter twenty pounds
mourning I give also to my Grand daughter Elice and her
Son Nicholas Elice twenty pounds for mourning I give
also to my Grandson Leaton twenty pounds for mourning
for him and his Wife Item I give to my Grand daughter
Isabella Budd Ten pounds for mourning and also five
hundred pounds in money I give also to my Grandson
William Leaton the youngest one hundred pounds I give
also to my Grandson John Angford Doctor Angford son
fifty pounds Item I give also to my Excutor George Morley
the little ffres and I have in Surrey Item I give also to my
servant Joan Durt all my wearing clothes of all sorts
both gownes and smocks and all other things I have wear

and I give her also the Bedstead 2 Bed 2 Bolster and 2 Blankets
1 Callico Quilt 1 Pillow a Canvas Mattress she lies on now
and the Curtains and Cover and all the Hangings that was in
my own Chamber at Malden and five pounds in money In
Witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal the 8
of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
