In addition to playing chamber music with friends and colleagues, she enjoys free-lancing with the various ensembles in the Pacific Northwest. This coming year Amy will embark on a series of solo recitals on the East and West Coasts with Pianist and great friend, Laura Kennedy. This past summer she performed at the Oregon Bach Festival, Chamber Music at The Barn in Wichita, KS and in Bend, OR at the Cascade Music Festival. In addition to music-making, she enjoys free-time with her family and dog and cat.

Cellist Andrew Kolb grew up in Sturgis, Michigan and attended the Eastman School of Music, University of Miami and SUNY Stony Brook. He has taught on the faculties of Memorial University of Newfoundland and Wichita State University, and was a member of the Fairmount String Quartet and principal cellist of the Wichita Symphony for six years. Currently, he is the principal cellist of the Eugene Symphony, and teaches and performs throughout the Pacific Northwest.
