A graduate of Escuela de Arte in Cuba, her dance studies included folkloric, popular, modern, ballet, choreography, composition and staging. Kati's international journey includes touring throughout Spain, Portugal, the Bahamas & Costa Rica, where she later resided for five years as an actor and dancer/choreographer for television. Now residing in Los Angeles, she taken on the responsibility to teach and cultivate Afro-Cuban culture by producing regular events and workshops that create a community that bridges dance and music across cultures. She is the co-founder of KimBámBula Productions, artistic director and choreographer of her own community-based Afro-Cuban dance and music experimental project, "Dancing From the Heart", and the cofounder of Afro-Timba, a dance fitness program that she is currently touring Nationwide. She also helped plan the 1st and 2nd annual "Heart of Cuba" events with Andiel Brown, who is also one of her dance students.

Miguel Bernal is a master percussionist, songwriter, and expert on the congas, bata drums, and many other instruments with abilities so unique he has been called a treasure of Cuba.
