GIREP Medal - The webinar provided an opportunity to recognize outstanding individuals in Physics Education. This year, Prof David Sokoloff [Oregon University, USA] was presented with the 2020 GIREP medal by the President of GIREP, Prof Marisa Michelini. Prior to presenting the medal, Prof Michelini invited Dr Eilish McLoughlin, GIREP Secretary, to briefly summarise Prof Sokoloff's contribution to Physics Education. Following the presentation of the medal, Prof Sokoloff delivered his keynote speech.

GIREP Anniversary Medal – The webinar provided a second opportunity to recognize the outstanding contribution of a distinguished personality to the sphere of Education – Hon Luigi Berlinguer. Prior to presenting to Hon Berlinguer with Anniversary medal, Prof Michelini invited Dr Dagmara Sokolowska, GIREP Vice-Presidenbt, to briefly summarise Hon Berlinguer's contribution to Education. Following the presentation of the medal, Hon Berlinguer delivered his reflections on the invaluable worth of education in today's world, to the GIREP participants.
