There are two options:

Tuesday & Thursday, 1000-1150: CAS 101H *Rousseau, Burke, and Revolution in France, 1791*, with Professor Alex Dracobly. Students are plunged into the intellectual, political, and ideological currents that surged through revolutionary Paris in the summer of 1791.

Monday & Wednesday: 1200-1350: CAS 101H *Defining a Nation: India on the Eve of Independence, 1945*, with Professor Ian McNeely. Students struggle to reconcile religious identity with nation building—perhaps the most intractable and important issue of the modern world.
